President's report

Dear Members

It gives me great pleasure to present to you the 2022-2023 annual report for your approval and adoption.

Firstly, on behalf of the Proserpine Golf Club I would like the thank each and every member for their support, participation and continued interest in the club, without which the club would not be able to grow and improve our course for the future membership.

I would also like to thank the numerous sponsors, volunteers and staff for their ongoing support and countless hours of blood sweat and tears to keep the course in what I think is the best condition we have seen for many years. There is still a long way to go and a lot to do but you can be assured that we will always strive to improve and develop the best possible playing conditions possible.

The pro shop team led by Roger are also thanked for their dedication and willingness to try new things. The club enjoys one of the best pro shops in North Queensland and is testimony to Roger's commitment to our club.

Secondly, as you will see from the audited financial report, the Proserpine Golf Club is in its strongest financial position for several years. Revenue in 22/23 saw an increase from the previous year from \$792,302 to \$1,198,488 and an increase of \$406,186 (51%) with an increase in profit from \$27,577 to \$205,410 (\$177,833 or 645%). This result puts the club in a strong financial position for the future.

The board has proposed that there will be no increase in membership fees, green fees or competition entry fees for the coming year as we strive to grow the membership base to allow more investment in improvements to the course and clubhouse. Bar and food prices may increase during the year as input costs are influenced by government duties and charges outside of our control.

In addition to the excellent financial result, we have paid out early all the outstanding equipment loans to clear the balance sheet of liabilities to ensure the club's capability of meeting its debts and commitments as they fall due.

The club significantly increased the investment in course maintenance and upkeep with an increase in chemicals, labour and equipment spending. The budget for 23/24 sees further increased investment in these areas to continue to make our golf course one of the best regional courses in Queensland.

The organisational benefit of a good result is that we have tentatively secured financial support from our bankers to fund the purchase of equipment to take the course to another level. The board are currently evaluating and investigating the purchase of a new fairway mower, rough areas mower and greens mower. We have recently purchased a Toro sand spreader which is already having a marked impact on the greens and course generally.

We have recently ordered ten new Yamaha buggies which will be delivered in several weeks and traded six of the existing buggies to increase the fleet from 20 to 23. The deal also includes the replacement of seats, wet weather covers, sand buckets and eskies to upgrade the remaining Yamaha buggies.

Membership and participation are the backbone of Proserpine Golf Club, and I am pleased to say that this financial year saw 120+ new members. That's an increase in membership to over 400 members, many of which came from the incentive program in December where new entrants to golf were introduced by existing members with the three-month trial. This led to many people joining the club in 2023 and currently regular players in both competition and social play. The "caddy for a day" promotion by Roger and his team was very well received and may well feature again this year. Small but not insignificant improvements like the practice nets are proving very popular with members and we hope to improve the practice fairway facilities during this year.

Other reports in this document will expand on various topics covered here and provide a clearer insight into the areas currently underway and the successes to date.

Finally, I would like to thank your board members for their efforts this year and say it has been my privilege to serve Proserpine Golf Club as its president for 2022/2023.

Club News and Events

The Pro Shop is updating members on a weekly basis about the weekly results, upcoming events, and other golf related / Pro Shop related news.

The **Win a Caddie Promotion** was well received, Nathan and I enjoyed the opportunity to fine tune members games out on the course.

Social Players

This year has seen a significant increase in the number of social players out on the course. The Monday and Wednesday Special offer of \$90 - 2 people and a motorised cart for 18 holes, or \$60 - 2 people and a motorised cart for 9 holes, is gaining popularity along with Friday, and Saturday and Sunday afternoons.

The Pro Shop has started to collect social players contact information to keep them involved in the club with offers and alert them of competitions in which they can play as a non-member.

Lessons

Through this financial year, we have conducted approximately 185 lessons - 140 (Roger) 45 (Nathan) for not only our club members, but we are also seeing players from Mackay, Bowen and Whitsunday Greens. The Flight Scope room is a draw card, especially through hot or rainy weather, and valuable in providing data for club fittings.

Clinics

We have conducted three Womens clinics this year with an average of 10 per clinic. We have fourteen new members because of these clinics and continue to work and keep in contact with past clinic participants. We have scheduled three Saturday morning clinics for both male and female with children participating for free in the September school holidays.

Competitions

Competition numbers continue to rise. We introduced a Tuesday and Sunday Club Competition this year and are seeing good numbers supporting these comps.

The Friday 9-hole competition commenced on 17th March with the Metropole Hotel coming on board as a sponsor.

Juniors

Our PGA Associate, Nathan Sothmann has been running the Junior Program for the Club. This year has been about re-building the Junior Program. As the Juniors grow there is an increasing need for a Junior Co-Ordinator, and we would like to see the Club fill that role as soon as possible (not filled at time of writing).

Scrambles

In October, I accompanied the Ladies Scramble side to Palmer Coolum Golf Club for the State Finals, and we had 3 teams compete in the Regional Mixed Finals held at Capricorn Resort in Yeppoon in the same month.

To date, this year we have conducted 2 PGA 'The Scramble" Events. The Ladies attracted a full field of 9 teams - the number necessary to send a team to the next level, with 20 of our Proserpine ladies competing in the event. The mixed team saw 27 teams competing, this number of players allows 2 teams to go to the next level. 23 of those teams were from our Club. This support from the members is very appreciated.

Handiskins

The Hankdiskins competition is underway this year. Three finalists, 3 other members and myself competed at Royal Pines, representing our Proserpine Golf Club.

Events

Turkey Day was well supported this year with 102 players. The Christmas period was very busy this year too as we ran competitions on most days. Social players were also out in force.

Australia Day had 98 players and increasing in popularity.

Easter Weekend competitions attracted 156 players over the 4 days.

Anzac Day - 68 players

May Day - 84 players

The annual **BC Day** was very well supported with 121 players and the day ran smoothly.

Open Championship

Numbers were slightly down on previous years for the ladies, although up from last year. The weather was challenging for all players over the weekend, especially on Friday and Saturday. The Mixed Open was well attended as was the Men's Open. The weekend ran smoothly and was followed by the annual 2-day Wintersun tournament.

Demo Days

Over the 2022-23 year we held 5 Demo Days and 1 In House Demo Day. These were all well attended and enabled our members to try a variety of clubs.

The conclusion of the 2022 Ladies Golfing Year saw a wonderful celebration of the golfing year with a luncheon at Sorrento's Restaurant with a great turn out of ladies attending. The presentation of trophies was conducted on Turkey Day in December with the following Honour Board Events being awarded. Lady Golfer of the Year was Elspeth Scotford, Ladies Order of Merit was won by Tiina Randmae, Trish McNeill was Ladies Matchplay Champion and Renae Maxwell won the Ladies Medal of Medals. Congratulations to these ladies. The awarding of Life Membership to Di Dobbins at the AGM was well deserved.

Despite the rainy days, our competition numbers on both Wednesdays and Saturdays were around the 15 mark with the biggest fields of 22 being seen in June when the weather was favourable. We also hosted quite a few travelling visitors throughout the year.

Club Championships for 2023 will be conducted at the end of this month and Mixed Foursomes Club Champions will be played in September.

Course Director's Report

After taking over as Course Director a huge amount of time and effort has gone into creating a plan to improve the course. There is still work to be done but at least we now have growth and much healthier looking greens thanks to Greenkeeper Rob Stanley and his team.

None of this work could have been done without consultation with Wade Cranston, head greenkeeper at Sarina Golf Club, and the support of our President Phil Batty who both knew the importance of playing on good greens.

We started the journey with helpful volunteers throwing sand while scarifying all 18 holes so we could build and be where we are today. Although this has been a practice for a long time at the club, I'm happy to say that with the purchase of a sand spreader, volunteers are no longer required to do this arduous task. The sand spreader is currently being used on a regular basis for light scarifying and will be used on fairway areas in the coming months.

We are aware of the encroaching tree roots on our greens and fairways and are currently planning to remove these by cutting the roots back.

Maintenance programs have now been set in place for our greens with constant monitoring practices, soil tests and the correct chemical programs. As we are in constant talks with the right professionals, the greens are responding.

All machinery has maintenance logs and the Board is looking at trading in older mowers and purchasing new ones.

We welcome Daniel Griffin to the team for 2023/4, full-time after several months of volunteering he has already proven to be an asset to the team. Daniel, and I will commence Turf Management certifications next financial year.

Our Patron Bill Woods along with all our volunteers have been incredible. From 'Dad's Army' on Mondays to the others who help with projects throughout the year, thanks Guys.

Rod Wecker was there with me all the way from repairing car park potholes, digging up old pipes, trenching and providing support with all other maintenance issues, along with John Grosskreutz and Alan Roberts, finishing up irrigation projects.

Rod has helped me complete other match committee tasks such as painting hazard pegs and marking the course layout. A worthy Club Captain, Rod Wecker would make.

In closing, I am committed to the focus on our tasks at hand, so the greens staff and I can continue to supply to our current and new members, as well as the community in general, the golf course they deserve.

I wish to thank all the members who have engaged with me in sharing their feedback and have donated their time and money to helping us to improve the golf course.




Profit & Loss Summary

Income Comparison 2021-22 & 2022-23





Income this Year


Income - July 2022 to June 2023


Income last Year

Income - July 2021 to June 2022




Expenses this Year

The financial statements cover Proserpine Golf Club Inc as an individual entity. Proserpine Golf Club Inc is a not-for-profit association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 ('the Act').

The principal activity of the association for the year ended 30 June 2023 is:

The running of a golf course in the Whitsunday region of Queensland

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of preparation

In the opinion of the committee of management, Proserpine Golf Club Inc is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

2 Summary of significant accounting policies

Income tax

The association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act* 1997.

Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

Grant Revenue

Government grants are recognised at fair value where there is reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all grant conditions will be met. Grants relating to expense items are recognised as income over the periods necessary to match the grant to the costs they are compensating. Grants relating to assets are credited to deferred income at fair value and are credited to income over the expected useful life of the assets on a straight-line basis.

Interest Revenue

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand, demand deposits and short- term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight- line basis over the assets useful life to the association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

Employee benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Employee benefits expected to be settled more than one year after the end of the reporting period have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may satisfy vesting requirements.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first -in-first-out basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
